Curriculum update

Mission and Values work started in January across school and enabled children to focus on values work along with essential personal and social development. We have been encouraging the children to develop their creativity as well as critical thinking skills, and the work they have produced has been fantastic.

My Happy Mind is a programme which we introduced in January and is helping children to grow in confidence, independence and resilience, providing them with a fantastic base for growing academic knowledge on. Information about the parent app was sent home before half term and I strongly encourage all families to make use of this. Please don't hesitate to contact school if you want further information.

Century Tech for KS2 has recently been introduced to enable children to practise areas they may lack confidence in with Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling as well as Maths. Please ask your child about what they are doing with this as we are excited about the difference it can make to pupil confidence and hopefully close any gaps arising as a result of the disruption caused by the pandemic over the last three years.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity and we have seen many children make much more progress in just a few days than we normally do over the course of a year.

Pools for Schools has been in school this term and has enabled every single child to have the opportunity to develop confidence and skills in the water in a safe environment. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity and we have seen many children make much more progress in just a few days than we normally do over the course of a year. We will be reviewing the impact of this and determining whether to continue this annually, reducing the cost of transport and access to

swimming externally and hopefully reducing the disruption to learning from the time spent travelling to and from the Leisure Centre.

Phonics and Early Reading is being reviewed and improved this half term with a new programme called Red Rose Phonics; once the new scheme is in place, parents will be invited in to find out more information about this but we do not anticipate it changing very much for home reading.

Acorn and Beech Class curriculum is being very clearly developed to enable all three year groups to have access to high quality provision and learning opportunities which take into account their current stage of development as well as address any gaps they may have as a result to the disruption to learning.

Pupil voice

This is going from strength to strength as we plan more opportunities for pupils to share their ideas, opinions and experiences. Pupil leadership through our Mission Leadership groups is very important to us. Please encourage your children to talk to their teacher about ways they can be involved in developing and improving our school.
