UKS2...

In Oak Class, we have enjoyed a shorter but busier and creative week! We built on our visit to church on Monday for the stations of the cross with our RE work, illustrating why Jesus is the bread of life and discussing the Easter vigil. To complete our Space topic, in Art we learned about Kandinsky, adapting his methods and techniques to create a mixed-media collage of the universe.



Rowan Class have worked their socks off this week, we have readily enjoyed our R.E lessons as part of Holy Week and took part in bread making after learning about Jesus as the bread of life and him spiritually feeding us. We kneaded the dough which in turn meant our loaves were lovely and soft. In maths we consolidated place value of numbers to one million including decimals.
